USA NORDIC COMBINED OLYMPIC HISTORY

US Olympic History: The United States has competed in Nordic combined at every Winter Olympics, since 1924. However, until the late 1990s, our record in this sport was less than outstanding. In 1932 at Lake Placid, Rolf Monsen placed 9th in the individual event, our only top 10 finish until Todd Lodwick finished 5th in the sprint and 7th in the individual event in 2002. We had a few team top 10s, notably a near-podium miss with 4th in 2002, after an 8th in 1992 and a 7th in 1994.

But the real breakthrough for the USA in Nordic combined came at Vancouver in 2010. Bill Demong won the large hill event, with Johnny Spillane second. Spillane added another silver medal in the normal hill event, and the team of Demong, Spillane, Lodwick, and Brett Camarota also placed second in the team event.

To date, Nordic combined remains a sport / discipline for men only at the Winter Olympics.
